Murdoch Developmental Center

Murdoch Developmental Center in Butner is one of North Carolina's three regional mental retardation centers operated by the Division of Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities and Substance Abuse Services of the Department of Health and Human Services. Murdoch Center provides comprehensive residential care for about 550 individuals from 25 counties in the state's North Central Region: Alamance, Caswell, Chatham, Davie, Durham, Forsyth, Franklin, Granville, Guilford, Iredell, Orange, Person, Rockingham, Stokes, Surry, Vance, Warren, and Yadkin.



OPERATION SANTA CLAUS

Our individuals range in age from 10 to 90 years. Many of the elderly clients' family members have passed away, while other individuals have no outside contact at all. Each year volunteer Services begin working in July to ensure that every individual at Murdoch Dev. Center receives presents on Christmas morning. Coordination of the Operation Santa Claus Project, which covers the 25-county area, which we serve, is a monumental task.
